From Pastor's Desk ...

"Parents are the pride of their children." Proverbs 17:6b

The famous author James Boswell often referred to a special day in his childhood when his father took him fishing. This fishing trip made such an impact on his young life that he even remembered the exact date, though many years had passed. In fact, that one day was so fixed in his adult mind, that whenever he was asked what contributed the most to shaping him into the man that he became, he would talk about the wonderful lessons he learned from his father on that one-day fishing excursion.

Having heard the story so often, one of Boswell's friends visited his now-widowed mother to get her impressions of the day her late husband took her son fishing. She couldn't recall the event, but she invited the visitor to look through her husband's diary.

Turning to the date he had heard Boswell repeat so often, he found only one brief sentence: *"Gone fishing today with my son -- a day wasted."*

Though Boswell's father never knew it, the time that he spent with his son that short day had an influence on his son that lasted a lifetime and beyond. Ideas were inlaid along the grain of his son's life that made him the man that he became. He must have hung on every word and each sliver of advice his father casually shared that day, and by living up to that advice, he became a respected author and a man honored for his integrity.

Too bad that Boswell's father could never appreciate the significance of a fishing trip and the difference that one day would make in his son's life.

Are today's children still being influ-

enced by the small, almost unnoticed moments they are spending with their fathers? You bet they are! And in those moments children are being shaped into the adults they will become. Regardless of an adolescent's protests to the contrary, children almost always grow up to be just like their parents. They do watch. They do listen. And eventually, they do imitate.

I have many memories of my father -- fishing trips, dinner table discussions, helping him carry his lunch bucket and shop apron when he came home from work. But often what I remember most are Sunday mornings. The care with which he tied his tie and put on the dress shoes that only came out of the closet on Sunday mornings. I remember the drive to church and how he led us to the same pew each week -- second pew, pulpit side. I doubt he ever gave this routine much thought, but I remember. I doubt he ever guessed there were lessons being taught in what he did, but there most certainly were. I learned and I remember -- and I smile.

And I weep inside only when I look out from my pulpit and see so many of our children at worship without their fathers. For them there are no lessons and no memories. And their fathers must think it will make no difference in the lives of their children. And they are wrong.

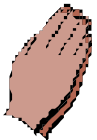

RECIPE CORNER

Macaroni & Cheese Pie

1 pkg. (7.25) oz. Kraft Macaroni & Cheese Dinner
 2 cups small broccoli florets
 4 eggs
 1 pkg. (6 oz.) Oscar Mayer Smoked Ham – chopped
 ½ cup Kraft shredded Cheddar & Monterey Jack Cheese
 1/8 tsp. garlic powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray pie plate with cooking spray. Cook pasta in boiling water until tender, adding broccoli during last 2 minutes of cooking time; drain.

Meanwhile, beat eggs in bowl. Stir in cheese sauce and ham until well blended. Pour egg mixture over pasta; stir to combine.

Spoon into prepared pie plate. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake 30 minutes or until set and golden brown.

Apple-Cheddar Salad with Walnuts

¼ cup apple cider or apple juice
 2 Tablespoons cider vinegar
 1 teaspoon honey
 ¼ teaspoon salt
 1/8 teaspoon coarsely ground black pepper
 1 medium (10 oz.) head Boston lettuce, torn into pieces
 1 pound (2 to 3 medium) Pink Lady, Honey Crisp or Empire apples, cored and thinly sliced
 ¼ cup walnuts, toasted
 3 (oz.) shaved extra-sharp Cheddar

In large serving bowl, whisk together cider, vinegar, honey, ¼ teaspoon salt, and 1/8 teaspoon coarsely ground black pepper. Add lettuce and apple slices to bowl and toss to coat. Arrange salad on 6 plates; top with walnuts and Cheddar cheese.

Quick & Easy Apple Crisp

5-6 granny smith apples
 3/4 cup sugar mixed with cinnamon to taste
 1 package (9 oz.) yellow cake mix
 2 Tablespoons sugar
 1 Tablespoon cinnamon
 1/4 cup butter
 1/2 cup chopped nuts
 Vanilla ice cream or Cool Whip Topping (optional)

Preheat oven to 350°F. Peel, core and slice apples. Place in deep dish baker, sprinkling with sugar and cinnamon mixture between layers.

Combine cake mix, sugar, cinnamon, butter, and nuts until crumbly. Sprinkle evenly over apples.

Bake 35-40 minutes. Serve warm with ice cream or whipped topping.

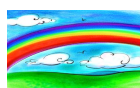

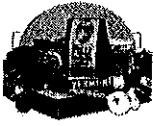
