February 3, 2010

Treasurers Report

- Beginning balance 1-6-10 \$933.73
- Check book balance as of 2-3-10 \$404.35
- Money market balance as 2-3-10 \$20,471.01
- Expenses 2-3-10 are \$1,860.83
- Items paid for by Boosters include: classroom money for teachers, school buses for field trips, CPR training for staff, sports banquet dinner and awards, babysitting for Booster meetings, supplies for Spanish and music rooms, computer technology.
- Motion to accept Treasurer's Report
- Motion granted and accepted by all

Principal's Report –

- Request for 7 & 8 grade, and possibly 5/6 to attend Milwaukee Public Museum to see Dead Sea Scrolls, plus Imax in April.
- Laptops for 7/8 grade are on hold
- Ideas were presented to attract young families to the school, including: carnival (tentative 4/17), open house in conjunction with spaghetti dinner in March. May be an annual event if successful.
- There will be a meeting with school board to discuss planning and needs for next school year. Goal is to have at least 50 kids in school and 60 in preschool. School families should provide numbers for enrollment to voters as soon as possible. Meeting will take place on 2/18 at 6:30. Babysitting will be available.

PC Lab Update

- PC lab is 99% operational
- A perpetual list of issues is being created in order to deal with them effectively.
- Server will be installed for memory upgrade on 2/5/10.

Scoreboard

- Scoreboard was purchased at a cost of \$494.00. Donator will be invoiced.
- First home game will be 2/16/10 from 5-6pm.
- Boosters will cover \$35 referee fee.
- Snacks and drinks will be sold during game.
- Ceiling lighting needs to be addressed before any home volleyball games can take place.

Spaghetti Dinner

- There is a need for people to do calling and checking on donations.
- Tickets are printed – 400 total with name and email only.
- No charge for kids 9 and under.
- Jim B. will take care of food order.
- Advertising will be via posters, ad in Hi-Liter & local newspapers (\$250), church bulletins, school website, printing of 3 special tickets for school families to hand out to friends, booth at Home & Commerce show (\$100), Post card mailing (cost of \$800), private business signs around town and press releases.
- Boosters will pay for booth at H&C show. Church will be invited to participate in booth.

New Business

- Jim Bakke discussed the need for the school to be more self sustaining and more independent from the church.
- Discussion was had regarding Boosters covering advertising for the school, sports programs and fees, capital equipment, and continuing education, and also replenishing some of the costs of what was spent by the church.
- Boosters agreed it is a benefit to all families to assist in the payment of these types of items.
- Decision was made to install 5-8 PC workstations in 7/8 classroom. Cost would be less than \$300 due to existing infrastructure.
- Spring Fling is set for 5/16. Dinner theater is tentative theme.
- CPR training is taking place on 2/16. \$15 cost for each participant – covered by Boosters.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm with closing prayer.
