From Pastor's Desk ...

"Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." Psalm 46:10

Before refrigeration, people used ice-boxes to preserve food. Every community had its icehouse to store the chunks of ice cut from streams and lakes during the winter months that would last into the summer months. The icehouse had thick walls, no windows, and tight-fitting doors, and plenty of sawdust to cover all the ice and absorb the water that came from melting ice.

One day a man lost a valuable watch in an icehouse. He searched diligently, carefully raking the sawdust, but to no avail. His friends gathered to help, but they all searched in vain. A small boy, after watching the fruitless search, slipped into the icehouse during the noon hour and emerged a short while later with the watch. The amazed grown-ups asked how he managed to find it, and so quickly too.

"I closed the door," the boy explained, "and then I sat down in the sawdust, and kept very still. Soon I heard the ticking of the watch."

In the weeks that lie ahead, many people will tell us what they expect us to be. Some will tell us to "be merry." Others will tell us to "be happy," or "be festive," or "be cheery," or "be jolly."

But in these weeks of Advent and during the subsequent season of Christmas, God will be telling us "to be" something else. He will be telling us to "be still." We don't often think of "stillness" or "quietness" as one our goals during this very busy and hectic time of Christmas. But "being still" is an essential ingredient

for us if we are to truly understand the Christmas that God would have us experience. It is only by "tuning out" the noise of our world that we are able to "hear" God speak to us in His Gospel -- the Good News that tells us that He loved us so much that He sent us His Son, born in Bethlehem, born of a Virgin, to be our Savior.

May we be challenged in the weeks ahead to spend time each day just "being still." Turn off the television and radio, set aside the shopping lists and wrapping paper, and open your Bible, "be still," and let God speak. Read Matthew 1, Luke 1-2, John 1, and the many other passages of Scripture where God tells us so clearly that He loved us too much to send us a card, instead He sent us a Son.

Because Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on Sundays this year, we will be having only one service on each of those Sundays, at 10:00 a.m.

On behalf of Lori and myself, I would like to thank all of you for your love and kindness to us this past year. It is our prayer that each of you has a blessed and Christ-centered Christmas and a joyous and God-directed new year.

FROM THE VICAR'S DESK

SOLUS CHRISTUS

This should be a “given,” but because our sinful nature is always looking for another way to salvation, some of the reformers spoke of “Solus Christus.” It is hard for this Vicar to understand why people want a savior besides our Lord Jesus Christ, but it seems that many do. That is why the Reformation maxim “Solus Christus” must be repeated loud and often still today.

If you pay attention to “religious news” in the nation’s media, you will hear of church bodies having conventions where they vote on whether or not Jesus Christ is to be confessed as the only way to heaven. How sad!

To have a vote is to say, in effect, that: [1] they are not sure of the very words of God’s Word; and [2] they can make something true or false by voting on it. Both are a sad commentary on our fallenness.

Every Christian can be sure of the words of the Word of God. And that word teaches, all over the place, that God alone is God and that through Christ alone there is salvation, the forgiveness of sins. God spoke through the prophet Isaiah (45:5) to say: “I am the Lord, and there is no other, . . .” In the confusion of our world today where many tell us that Christians may worship “God by another name, Allah” and things like that, that those who offer such counsel are false prophets who misrepresent God.

In John 14:6 Jesus said, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.” In Acts 4:12, we get to hear the bold declaration of the apostles of the early Church where, living in a pluralistic and very “tolerant” culture, they confessed plainly, “And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

And this “solus Christus” is also for the comfort of sinners. You do not need to subscribe to some fancy philosophy in order to have the forgiveness of your sins. Only one could pay the price and that One has paid the price: Christ Jesus Himself. He is the very One Who also arose again, Who has ascended to the Father’s right hand, Who is preparing a heavenly home for you, and Who will come to judge the world and take His beloved Church home to heaven. And there is no one else. So don’t sweat it. Just know and hope in Christ — alone!

THE SOLA’S AND YOU!

As you have hopefully noted already, the reformers did not speak of these “sola’s” simply for the sake of making up something to teach.

There were two driving reasons for letting these maxims stand boldly in the fore: [1] God and His Word must be truly represented. All doctrine eventually supports the message of the Gospel, namely, that God in Christ has reconciled the world to Himself. and [2] death and hell are very real and we do not want people to end up in hell after they die. The person who lives with death all his life (“yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death . . .” -

Psalm 23:4) may be sure, on his deathbed, that Scripture has taught him the truth about his sins and his Savior, that he may stand before God because God is so very full of grace (“grace” is a “totally free, undeserved gift”), that he is able to go to heaven because God has worked faith in his heart to believe it, and that he needs no one other than Jesus Christ in order to be with God for all of eternity.

This very same thing is true for you, dear reader. We teach the “sola’s” of the Reformation because they are for your soul’s good. It is totally accurate and truthful for us to say that you and I may have salvation “by grace, through faith, for Christ’s sake” alone!

SOLI DEO GLORIA

Since the above is true, we confess that “to God alone be the glory.” Do not give the glory for your salvation to your pastor, your family, your membership in a congregation, your money, your personal piety, or anything else. The glory belongs to God.

We say ‘To God alone be the glory’ in a happy, joyful way, since we can rejoice that God has worked salvation for us. This is truly God’s gift to us!

May the Lord grant you all joy in the message of His Scriptures, which tell you of His grace, by which He works the true faith within you, a faith which hopes only in your Lord Jesus Christ, and which causes you regularly to exult (even at times when you don’t feel particularly happy), “To God alone be the glory!”

RECIPE CORNER

HAM & CHEESE PUFF

Ingredients

- 1 loaf (Italian) bread, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 3 cup(s) (about 1 lb.) ham, boneless fully cooked
- 12 oz. (cubed) Monterey Jack/Muenster cheese
- 2 Tbsp butter
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 8 large eggs
- 3 ½ cups milk
- ¼ cup (prepared) mustard

Directions

1. Coat a 9" by 13" baking dish with nonstick cooking spray. In a large bowl, toss together bread cubes, ham and cheese. Spread mixture in baking dish.
2. In skillet over medium heat, melt butter. Add onion and cook, stirring, about 5 minutes or until softened; set aside to cool. In bowl, whisk together eggs, milk and mustard. Stir in cooled onions. Pour mixture over bread cubes. Cover and refrigerate overnight.
3. When ready to bake, remove baking dish from refrigerator and let it sit on counter for 30 minutes. Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Bake puff, uncovered, for 55 to 70 minutes, until knife inserted near the center comes out clean.
