Looking forward to the Fourth Sunday after Trinity

Monday: Genesis 50:15-21

Tuesday: Romans 8:18-23

Wednesday: Luke 6:36-42

Thursday: "Be merciful, just as your Father also is merciful"(Luke 6:36-42). The old Adam in us, however, wants to condemn and seek vengeance. But the Lord says, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay" (Rom 12:14-21). To condemn, to avenge yourself, is to put yourself in the place of God. It is to fail to trust that He is just. Ultimately, it is to disbelieve that Jesus suffered the full vengeance for all wrongs. Only Christ is merciful as the Father is merciful. He is the one who overcame all evil with the good of His cross, forgiving even His executioners. Jesus is our Joseph, who comforts us with words of pardon and reconciliation (Gen 50:15-21). He is the One who does not condemn but gives life that runs over. Only through faith in Christ are we sons of the Father, being merciful, forgiving, doing good to our enemies. For in Christ we know that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us (Rom 8:8-13).

Catechism for the Week: Table of Duties: To Workers of All Kinds

What does God’s Word say to workers of all kinds? Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but like slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men, because you know that the Lord will reward everyone for whatever good he does, whether he is slave or free. (Ephesians 6:5-8)

Collect of the Week (from Lutheran Prayer Companion)

Lord God heavenly Father, who are merciful, and by Your Son, Jesus Christ, promised to forgive all our sins: we heartily beseech You not to judge us according to our wicked life, unrighteous conduct, and many sins committed out of human weakness, but as our heavenly Father, to whom our weakness is well known, to pardon and forgive these all according to Your divine, fatherly heart and to bestow on us the crown of eternal salvation; and further, to soften our hearts of stone, that we may gladly forgive our neighbors, show them mercy, judge and condemn no one falsely with a premature, unreasonable, and precipitous judgment, as often happens, but with all our hearts gladly pardon and forgive all men, and first being true, honest, and good judges only of our own selves, consciences, hearts, and souls, lead a Christian life in Your fear and die a blessed death. Amen.
