"What Is God's Plan?"

It is always fitting to follow our Lord's example and pray that our Father's will be done in our lives. As His children we submit to His authority and trust that He supplies us with everything necessary to support this body and life.

Yet, I will from time to time ask the question, "What is God's plan in all of this?" I look around here in our own church and community and ask this question. I have wondered this often over the last year regarding our Rainbow Preschool. I often pray, "Lord, help us to see Your will for this part of our church family." It was quite the surprise for all of us to watch as it went from a well-oiled machine with all the necessary parts to run 3 classrooms, to in a short time, one part with 1 classroom. Lord, what is Your will for us?

In 2020 many had an opportunity to see more clearly what our children and grand-children were being taught. For years the majority have been taught things that are outright blasphemous (evolution) and we have seen Christian morality being chipped further and further out of the foundation. St. Peter's has had two schools in her history. The first began when the church was planted in 1864 (and ran for at least 50 years), and the second from 1998-2011. Did those closures mean that the Lord did not want His children to be taught the truth daily? What is the role of Father and Mother, education, the Church? Lord, what is Your will for us?

For the years leading up to and following Pastor Bischoff's retirement I had people ask if we were going to reenter the vicarage program. The year before we made the decision to do so, District President Wille asked if we would consider having one. And so we decided to reapply. We also decided it would make sense to have a place for him and his family (if applicable) to live. The opportunity arose and we purchased a house close to church. But, the number of men in seminary did not bear out that we received a vicar, either last year or this year. We decided that we will try again next year. Lord,

what is Your will for us?

I have watched the incessant bickering on all things community related in Waterford for some time. Town vs. Village. Every decision met with scorn and anger. Meanwhile, I know that it would be better to have community and that the Lord placed us here 160 years ago for His purpose.

I have for years contemplated ways for us to be more active and visible in our community, so I joined the board for Explore Waterford. I gave my vision for EW. Part of it is applicable here: Jesus said, "'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it: 'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself" (Matthew 22:37-39).... [W]e look at those in our community as our neighbors. That we love them as we love ourselves. That the members of our community ... treat each other with decency and love, as well as work together toward the common good. While we are imperfect people, my vision is that we would strive to help our neighbor to improve and protect his property and business and to not tell lies, betray, slander, nor defame our neighbor, but defend him, speak well of him, and put the best construction on everything." (Small Catechesis) Lord, what is Your will for us?

In conclusion, Luther on the Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer:

"Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. What does this mean? Answer: The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer; but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also. How is this done? Answer: When God breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us hallow God's name or let His kingdom come; and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith unto we die. This is His good and gracious will."

RECIPE CORNER

Cheesecake Squares

2 pkgs 8 oz cream cheese 1 cup sugar 1 egg 1 tsp vanilla 2 pkgs crescent rolls 1/3 c. sugar 1 tsp cinnamon

Mix 1st four ingredients with beater until smooth. In 9 x 13 pan place one pkg crescent rolls on bottom pressing edges together & part way up sides of pan. Pour cream cheese mixture over rolls. Place the second pkg crescent rolls on top. Sprinkle with mixture of 1/3 cup sugar & 1 tsp cinnamon. Top with chopped nuts (optional).

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Cool thoroughly before cutting.




